Getting there

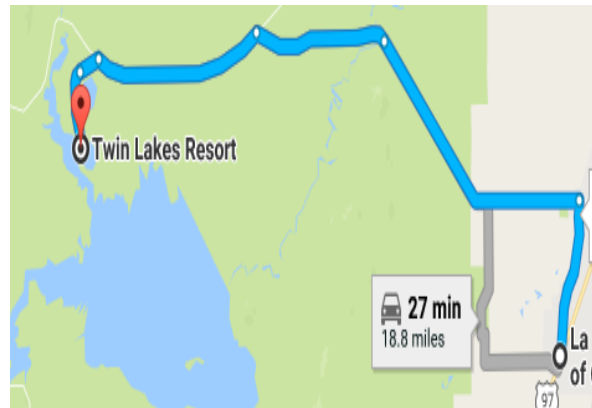
Head north on Huntington Rd for 2.5 miles

Before You Go:

Get your fishing license and National Park Day Use pass before you go. Neither are available at the resort.

Day Passes may be purchased at Ace Hardware at the corner of Huntington and 1st St., plus any of the following Interagency Passes: Annual, Military, Senior, Access, 4th Grade, or Northwest Forest Pass. The Corner Store on the way to the lake at Pine Forest & Burgess Rd. also has all passes!

Fishing licenses are available at Bi-Mart, and across the street at Ace Hardware.

Amenities:

The resort includes a restaurant, convenience store, boat rentals, boat launch and more. See their website at TwinLakesResort.net

The Day Use area has restrooms, water, picnic tables, and paved parking.

The Lakeshore Loop trail is about 1.7 miles. Animals to look for include bald eagles, osprey, ducks, dragonflies, and frogs.
