

Accessible Wilderness

can be found at Shelter Cove. Come for a great day of hiking and fishing - the limit is **30** Kokanee per day. Bring your picnic, or stop in at the Shelter Cove restaurant for a great burger.



Bring your kayak or boat—they'll put the boat in the water for free. There are also several trails in the Diamond Peak Wilderness accessible directly across the street from the Shelter Cove entrance. Just walk up the access road to cross the railroad tracks and follow the trail on the other side.



Getting there:

Distance to Shelter Cove from La Pine Chamber: 42 miles

Driving time: 50 minutes

Left onto US-97 S for 17.5 miles

Right onto Crescent Rd/Crescent Cutoff Rd for 12 miles

Right onto OR-58 W for 10.5 miles

Left at the Shelter Cove sign on NF-5810 to NF-350 for 2.3 miles

Left onto NF-5810 for 2 miles

Left at the Shelter Cove sign.
